## Marine Sanctuary News

The dive season is well underway, visibility, nutrient rich waters, and shorter days have helped in bringing out divers to Monterey. Things are also busy at Monterey Bay National Marine Sanctuary's Office as well. The Management Plan proposal is almost ready for review and we should see the results in Spring 2019. The Advisory Council has been busy this last year and are fine tuning our top ten issues related to Marine Sanctuary projects.

Keith Rootsart is happy to report the California Department of Fish and Wildlife has approved a Reef Check/PISCO application for a Special Collection Permit to perform a urchin removal/kelp restoration experiment in the Pacific Grove Gardens Marine Conservation Area west of Lovers Point. Recon efforts are presently underway with partners from Reef Check California, Monterey Bay Aquarium and Monterey Abalone Company to identify appropriate rock outcroppings. In the spring we will do urchin manipulations to determine at what urchin density kelp will reestablish.

Marine Life Studies is partnering with Monterey Bay Diving and Monterey Bay National Marine Sanctuary in applying for a grant to remove derelict crab pot fishing gear and the associated abandoned crab pot lines in and around Moss Landing and Southern parts of Monterey Bay. This is a huge win and we are excited to begin an active removal effort on this mountain of material.

Advisory Council primary diving representative, Brian Nelson, is now serving as the Chair of the SAC Executive Committee. For the next year he will preside over the bi-monthly Advisory Council meetings and keep the trains running on time. It is nice to see our diving representative take the seat at the head table and ensure diving interests are well represented.

## State Parks' streamed video shows sunken Tahoe shipwreck

A new state park designated underwater trail at Emerald Bay State Park at Lake Tahoe includes the largest collection of sunken boats in America. The eight-minute video posted on the State Parks Facebook page ([www.facebook.com/CaliforniaStateParks/](http://www.facebook.com/CaliforniaStateParks/)) shows a 100-foot barge on the bottom of Emerald Bay at Lake Tahoe. It is the public's first look at a new underwater trail at Emerald Bay State Park that leads to two barges and 12 recreational boats (Dippers have been diving on some of these boats and barges in the past.).

It was broadcast on Facebook Live as the Department of Parks unveiled the Emerald Bay Maritime Heritage Trail. To see the video, go to Facebook, and under search, type in "Diving in Emerald Bay" and select the video from California State Parks.

The hope was to broadcast a live dive to the sites, a landmark attempt to provide a first look at several sunken wrecks. However, there were problems from the start. First, the video was delayed by 56 minutes, which caused only about 40 people to stick around to see it (there have been more than 2,500 views of the video). The divers then showed the 100-foot barge and not a vintage 27-foot launch, which — along with other sport craft — was expected to be the star of the show. Those who narrated the event appeared to be winging it and said they didn't know whether their comments were being aired.

In any case, for anyone who hasn't dived these wrecks the video offers a unique glimpse of Lake Tahoe's past. It would make many wonder what else is down there, and perhaps want to learn how to scuba dive to see the other sunken treasures.

Tahoe's depth, cold and altitude preserve anything that goes down. Many have long figured there are mobsters from the roaring '20s, perhaps with bullet holes in their foreheads and wearing pinstripe suits that are preserved perfectly in the depths off South Lake Tahoe.

To help divers locate the wrecks in Emerald Bay, State Parks is providing GPS locations and waterproof interpretive cards, and on the lake bottom, each of the sites is placarded. The locations for three of the dive sites had not been released until now, said Adeline Yee of State Parks.

# Thanks! - Any Water Sports Retirement, Ownership, & Christmas Party

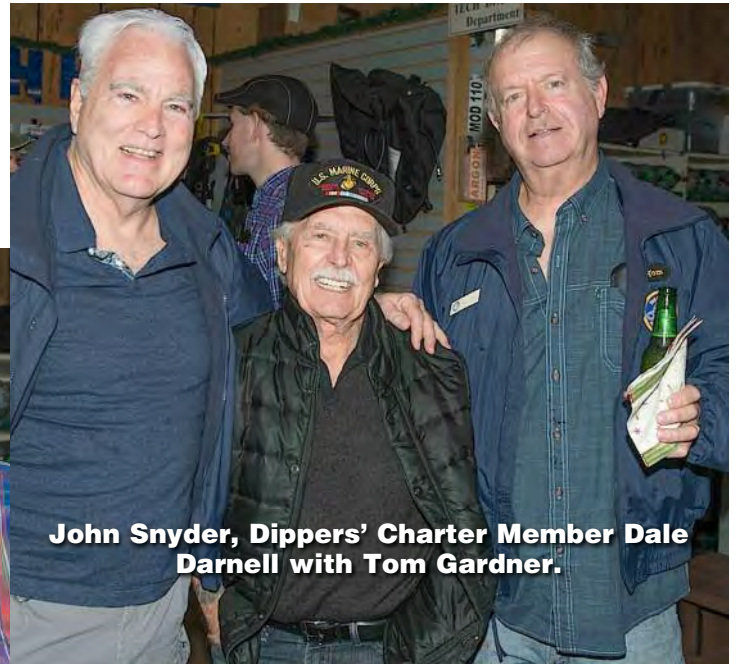

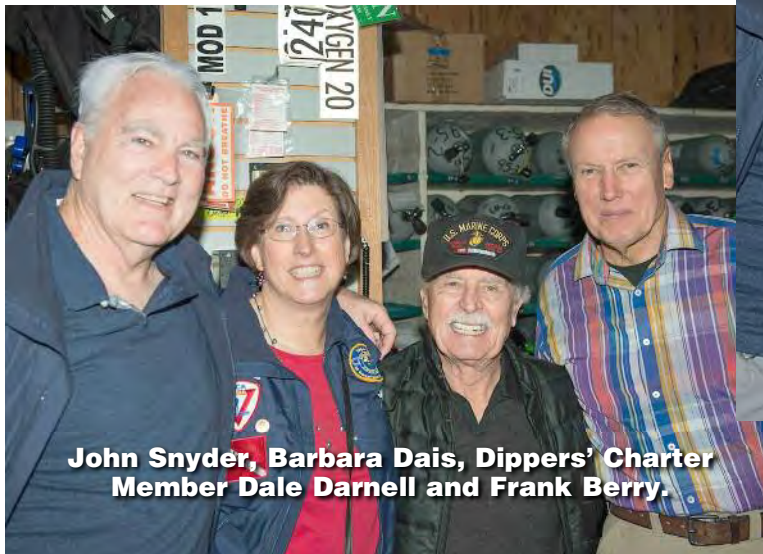

## New coastal access App available

Five years ago, Facebook billionaire Sean Parker held an extravagant wedding in Big Sur, after which he agreed to pay \$2.5 million to settle violations of California's coastal laws because his crews built rock walls, a stone bridge, a cottage, dance floor and other structures in a sensitive redwood forest — without permits.

As part of the settlement, he also agreed to help create a new mobile phone app so that anyone wanting to visit the coast in California could easily find public beaches, trails and parking. The new app, called YourCoast, went live. It can be downloaded from Apple iTunes for free.

"This is a case of turning lemons into lemonade," said Lisa Haage, the California Coastal Commission's chief of enforcement. "We literally ended up working with some of the world's best tech engineers to create something that everyone can use and enjoy."

Currently, the app only works on Apple iPhones. For owners of other phones, the information is on a Coastal Commission website, at [www.yourcoast.org](http://www.yourcoast.org).

The new app pinpoints the locations of 1,563 public beaches, including places in Malibu that wealthy property owners have worked over the years to keep secret or dissuade the public from visiting. "It's great. I downloaded it," said Jennifer Savage, California policy manager with the Surfrider Foundation, an environmental group. "I love that it makes it so easy for people see what beaches are near them, along with information about how to get there and parking. It reinforces people's sense that the coast belongs to them. A lot of times you might not see the access ways or know if something is public or private. The app arms people with more information and confidence."

The new app provides directions, photos and information about restrooms, parking, disabled access, dog rules and other issues, including locations of campgrounds and surfing

spots. Users can upload photos of beaches and share locations on Facebook, Twitter and other social media.

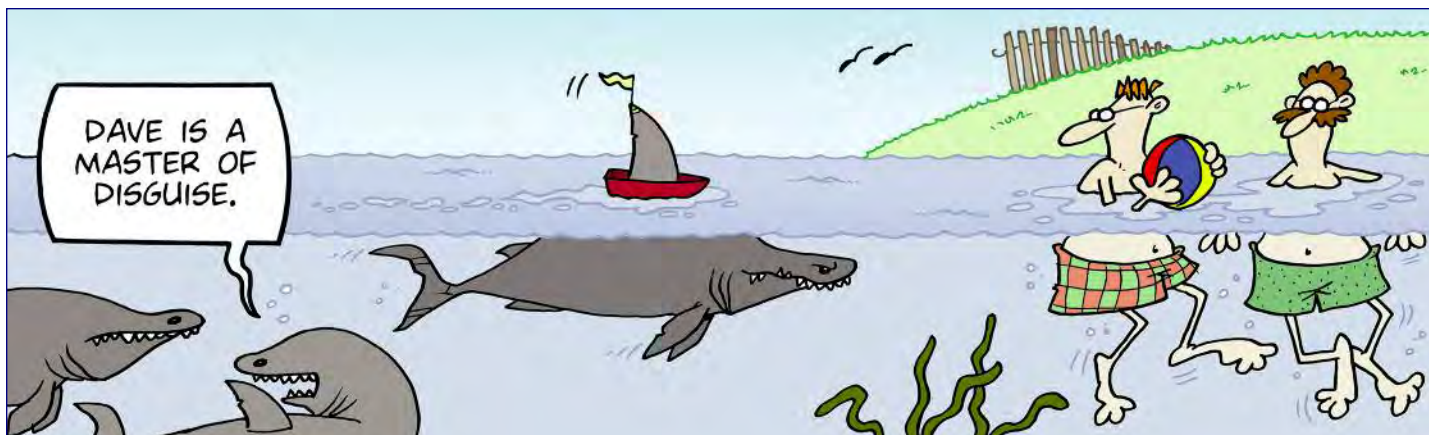
Parker, 39, is the founder of Napster, the former music file-sharing company, and was former president of Facebook, having helped build the company in its early days with now CEO Mark Zuckerberg. His net worth is estimated at \$2.7 billion by Forbes magazine. Parker married singer-songwriter Alexandra Lenas, in June 2013 at a campground along Highway 1 in Big Sur owned by the Ventana Inn, an adjacent luxury hotel. The couple held a wedding with a Lord of the Rings theme that featured hundreds of guests, including California Gov.-elect Gavin Newsom, Twitter CEO Jack Dorsey and others. But the event ran afoul of the coastal commission, the state agency that regulates development along the coast.

Parker paid to tear out the structures installed for his wedding and to restore the campground forest. During the investigation, however, the commission found that the Ventana Inn also was in violation of its original building permit, which required it to keep the campground open to the public. The Inn's owners, who had closed the campground multiple times over several years, faced \$1.5 million in penalties from the commission. They told Parker that unless he paid their penalties, they would cancel his wedding.

He paid, and agreed to pay other penalties, with the entire settlement totaling \$2.5 million. Much of the money was used to build public trails in Big Sur, along with other public projects along the coast.

"We were kicking around ideas," Haage said of the settlement talks with Parker. "We wanted to do something more creative than just upping the amount of money. He had a unique ability to provide and facilitate something like an app development. He's one of the world leaders in tech. He was excited about it and we were excited about it."

Parker, who lives in Los Angeles, is now an investor and philanthropist. In 2015, he donated \$600 million to launch the Parker Foundation to fund science, global health and civic engagement projects. In 2016, the foundation announced a \$250 million grant to establish the Parker Institute for Cancer Immunotherapy, a San Francisco-based research center working to find a cure for cancer. ★

## **Getty Museum ordered to return statue**

Italy's highest court has ruled that the J. Paul Getty Museum in Los Angeles must hand over an ancient Greek statue that was first discovered by Italian fisherman. The Getty Museum argues that since the statue is Greek, not Italian, it "is not and has never been part of Italy's cultural heritage." The museum says it believes the court order violates U.S. and international law, and that it plans to "continue to defend our legal right to the statue."

The museum purchased "Statue of a

Victorious Youth," a bronze piece of art dated to 300-100 B.C., for nearly \$4 million in 1977. It's one of only a few life-size Greek bronze statues to have survived to the modern day, according to the Getty

Museum. The museum says Romans probably took the statue from its original location in 100 B.C. - 100 A.D., and a shipwreck caused the statue to be preserved in the sea.

The circumstances surrounding the sale of the statue "are undeniably murky," The Local Italy reports: "When the Fano fishermen realized what they had pulled up in their nets, they moved hastily to sell it to a local dealer without informing the Italian authorities, getting the equivalent of around €3,500 for their haul. The 2,000-year-old artwork, still covered in barnacles from its centuries underwater, was subsequently smuggled in vans and hidden in garages, under a priest's stairs and even, according to some accounts, buried in a cabbage patch to avoid detection. It's not known how or when it left Italy, but by the early 1970s it had been spotted in Brazil, Britain and finally Germany, where it underwent restoration." ★

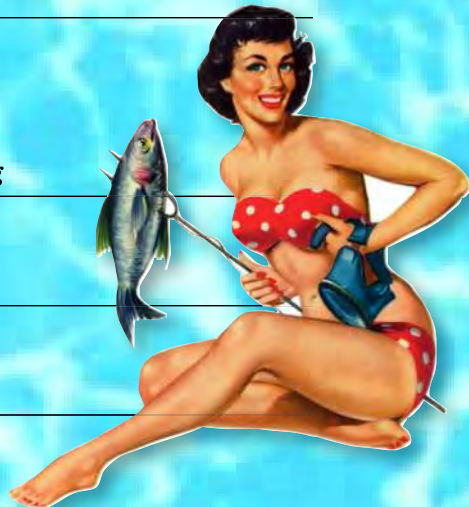
