





## Apple Watch Warning

A Port Barrington (IL) diver who has recovered more than 200 Apple watches from Indiana's Chain O' Lakes warns Apple watch owners to stay out of the water if their watches have the original band. Derick Langos says that those with sports bands do not stay on in the water. Langos also frequently finds smartphones, rings, jewelry and prescription glasses underwater.

### Should you Insure Old Scuba Gear? Undercurrent

It's not uncommon for divers with equipment insurance to find out that their insurer will pay them little money, if any, because their equipment is too old. DAN insurance, underwritten by H20, has changed how they determine what to reimburse you and says it will be the lesser of (1) the cost of reasonably restoring that property to its condition immediately before loss or damage or (2) the cost of replacing that property with substantially identical property. How does property get valued? The best way is for you to find advertised sales of an identical or similar item of the same age from a dependable source (your dive shop, eBay, or other online sources). Better yet, see if you can find proof of sale of such an item.

If one can't come up with evidence of the product's current value (so repair or replacement can be compared), the insurance company may turn to a depreciation schedule. According to The Curley Adjustment Bureau, a consultant to the insurance industry on value, cameras have a 14-year life, while scuba gear has a 10-year life. While insurers may use different schedules, this provides a benchmark for estimating your gear's value.

When you file a claim, there is often a deductible, reducing your reimbursement. DAN insurance deductibles range from \$100-\$250.

If you decide to apply for insurance, don't value your fiveyear-old gear at the price you paid because you'll be paying for a value that won't hold for the insurance company. If you paid \$5,000 for your gear five years ago and seek that coverage, the price is \$213. But, it's perhaps worth half that today, so insure it at \$2500 and pay \$106.  $\clubsuit$

# Experts disclose new details about 300-year-old shipwreck

concern that recovering the treasure for sale rather than for its historical value "would cause the irretrievable loss of significant heritage."

"Allowing the commercial exploitation of Colombia's

The Colombian government said Thursday it will try to raise objects from the 1708 shipwreck of the galleon San Jose, which is believed to contain a cargo worth billions of dollars. The 300-year-old wreck, often called the "holy grail of shipwrecks," has been controversial, because it is both an archaeological and economic treasure.

Culture Minister Juan David Correa said the first attempts will be made between April and May, depending on ocean conditions in the Caribbean. Correa

in the Caribbean. Correa pledged it would be a scientific expedition. "This is an archaeological wreck, not a treasure," Correa said following a meeting with President Gustavo Petro. "This is an opportunity for us to become a country at the forefront of underwater archaeological research."

But the ship is believed to hold 11 million gold and silver coins, emeralds and other precious cargo from Spanishcontrolled colonies, which could be worth billions of dollars if ever recovered. Correa said the material extracted from the wreck, probably by robotic or submersible craft, would be taken aboard a navy ship for analysis. Based on the results, a second effort might be scheduled.


The San Jose galleon sank in battle with British ships more than 300 years ago. It was located in 2015 but has been

mired in legal and diplomatic disputes. In 2018, the Colombian government abandoned plans to excavate the wreck, amid disputes with a private firm that claims some salvage rights based on a 1980s agreement with Colombian government. In 2018, the United Nations cultural agency called on Colombia not to commercially exploit the wreck.

A UNESCO experts' body protecting underwater cultural heritage sent a letter to Colombia expressing







The wreck was discovered three years ago with the help of an international team of experts and autonomous underwater vehicles, and its

exact location is a state secret. The ship sank somewhere in the wide area off Colombia's Baru peninsula, south of Cartagena, in the Caribbean Sea. The ship has been the subject of a legal battle in the U.S., Colombia and Spain over who owns the rights to sunken the treasure.

The three-decked San Jose was reportedly 150 feet (45 meters) long, with a beam of 45

feet (14 meters) and armed with 64 guns. Colombia has said that researchers found bronze cannons that are in good condition, along with ceramic and porcelain vases personal weapons. and The researchers say that the specifications of the cannons leave no doubt that the wreck is that of the San Jose. 🗘
